TUITION ASSISTANCE

Tuition Assistance (TA) For Active Duty

- TA pays tuition costs up to \$250 per semester hour or \$166.67 per quarter hour
- TA does not cover book costs
- The maximum TA per fiscal year is \$4,500

GI BILL

The Montgomery GI Bill CH 30

- Must have contributed \$1200 to be eligible

The Post-9/11 GI Bill CH 33

- Must have served on Active Duty on or after 11 September 2001 to be eligible
- TEB - Transfer of Education Benefits, learn how to transfer your benefits to your family member

Top-Up

- Allows the use of GI Bill in conjunction with Tuition Assistance
